Marya showed a top she was wearing, constructed from four fabrics. She also showed a jacket made of turned taquete.

Marie Christine showed pants she had made. All the above are members of the Garment SIG.

Betty showed two striking rugs, a twill runner in cottolin and a knit shawl.

Ann showed a runner and a bead necklace made of thrums and pipe cleaners.

Lizzy showed a poncho and a length of fabric.

Linda showed a purse made of tencel, part of the fabric she wove to make several other items as well.

Silvia showed a series of towels in beautiful colors.

Kathy Briles showed items she had made from a warp tied onto her K. Weber workshop warp. The included turned taquete and warp rep, which she used to make place mats.

Jannie showed items made from an 8-shaft echo and iris mandala threaded warp. They are part of the weaving she has done as part of an article she has written for Robin Spady’s online, journal, Heddlecraft.

D’Elin showed bead necklaces in her new series, Ocean Sunset, inspired by Ragged Point.

2017/18 Challenge – Members presented the scarves they had woven, using colors standing for Central Coast Weavers. They included cerise, chocolate, corn, cerulean, chartreuse, carrot, copper, cobalt, cranberry; white, wisteria, wheat, walnut, waterfall, wine, watermelon, whiskey, and wintergreen. Members interpreted these colors in their individual ways.

Nancy – cranberry, cerise and watermelon.

Jannie – cerise, cerulean and wine.

Sandra – cerulean, waterfall and cobalt.

Yvonne – cerise, wine and chartreuse.

Silvia – cerise, cobalt and wine.

Roberta – cobalt, chartreuse and walnut.

Linda – cerise, chartreuse and watermelon.

Karen – wheat, copper and chlorophyll.

Rosemary – cobalt, cerulean and waterfall.

Pat – cranberry, cerulean and ? (momentary secretarial failure).

Kathy Briles – charcoal, wine and cheddar.

Betty – cerise, cerulean and cobalt.

Becky had an IOU project to be woven in cobalt, chartreuse and wine.

2018/19 Challenge – Nancy presented the new challenge, which is a table runner at least 42 inches long, woven in shadow weave. To facilitate our success, Jannie will present a 3-day workshop on shadow weave, August 17 to 19.
