

Woven Napkin Rings Lorelea Roberts



Materials Needed

11 - #3 @ 12"
3/16 or 1/4 FF or FO @ ~ 7'
(You could also use cane)

Other Items Needed

Water container
Tape measurer
2" prescription bottle or any firm
container with a 2" diameter for a
mold. Can be smaller, just use
what you have on hand!
Rubber Band

Napkin rings measure 2 1/4" height
and diameter will be whatever
your mold size.

The Story

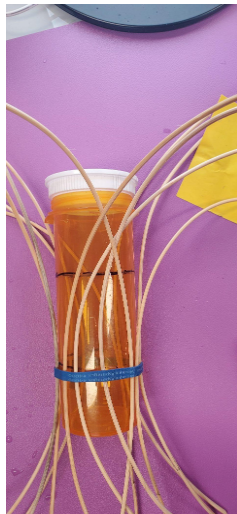

Let's Get Started

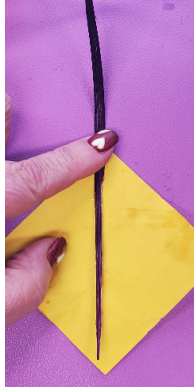
- **Wet your spokes**



- While they are soaking, mark a 2" space on your mold.
- Place your 11 spokes evenly on your mold with a rubber band holding them. There should be 5 inches above and below your 2 inch marks.



- Taper your weaver and begin weaving over/under continuously around the

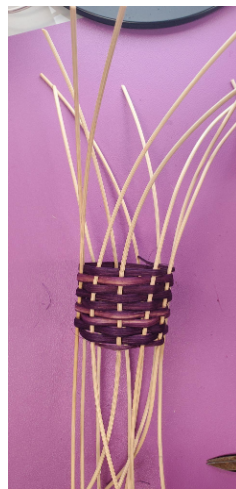


mold.

- After you have 3 rows in you can adjust your spokes to be evenly spaced.



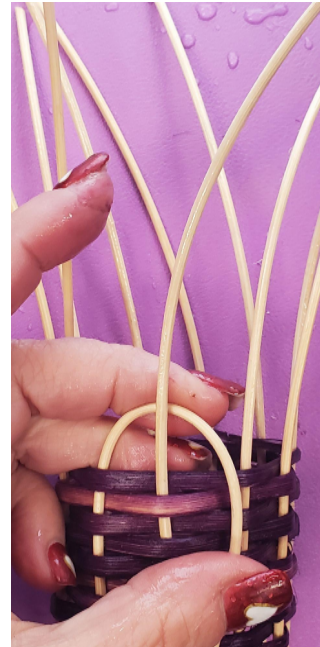
- Weave until you have 2 inches woven, taper end to match taper in



beginning, then remove from the mold.

Begin Rim

➤ Row 1 - Do both sides

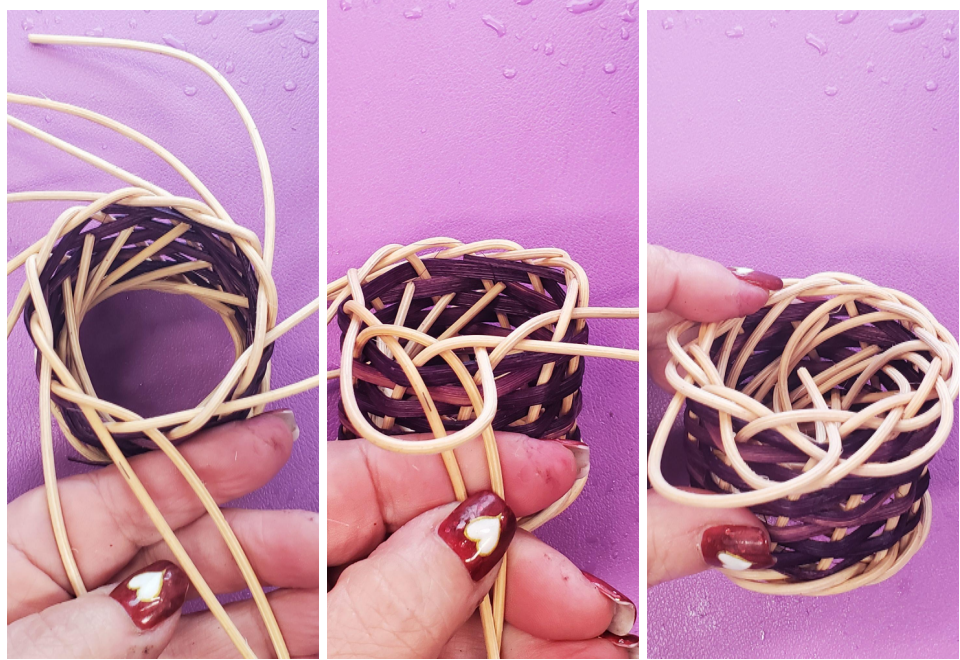


- Behind one and out all the way around
- Loosen first spoke and insert where the tool is in the picture.



➤ Row 2 - Do both sides

- Grab 3 spokes, Take the left one over 2 and in all the way around



- Use your thumb to make sure all spokes are pushed in
- Let dry 24 hours. Round reed swells when wet. Wait until dry to trim so ends will not pop out.



- Trim spokes.
